

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## Pulp Fiction

A cocktail that pays homage to the classic pulp magazines of the 20th century and the anthology of 21st century pulps in the PDF. It's a mix of bourbon, lemon juice, grenadine, and blue curacao, creating a layered drink that resembles the colorful covers of the pulp fiction genre.

### Ingredients:

- 2 oz bourbon
- 1 oz lemon juice
- 1/2 oz grenadine
- 1/2 oz blue curacao

### Instructions:

- Fill a cocktail shaker with ice and add the bourbon and lemon juice. Shake well and strain into a chilled coupe glass.
- Slowly pour the grenadine over the back of a spoon along the edge of the glass, so it sinks to the bottom and creates a red layer.
- Repeat the same process with the blue curacao, pouring it over the back of a spoon along the opposite edge of the glass, so it creates a blue layer on top of the red one.
