Mexican Fiesta Theme

- Decorations: Bright, colorful banners, papel picado, and traditional Mexican tablecloths.
- Food & Drinks: Serve huevos mexicanos, tortillas, and Mexican pastries like pan dulces. Offer coffee with half and half, and perhaps some margaritas or horchata.

- Food & Drinks: Serve coffee, eggy tortillas, and other breakfast items like croissants and fresh fruit.
- Activities: Discuss the book over breakfast, and perhaps have a debate about the characters' decisions and motivations.

Hostage Negotiation Theme

- Decorations: Create a serious, intense atmosphere with dim lighting and a mock "negotiation room."
- Food & Drinks: Keep it simple with coffee and light snacks.
- **Activities**: Role-play a hostage negotiation scenario inspired by the book, and discuss the ethical dilemmas faced by the characters.

Family Reunion Theme

- **Decorations**: Use family photos, heirlooms, and cozy home decor.
- Food & Drinks: Serve a family-style meal with dishes like casseroles and homemade desserts.
- Activities: Share personal stories and discuss the family dynamics in the book, and how they relate to your own experiences.

THEMED PARTY SUGGESTIONS

Appetizers

- Guacamole and Chips: Fresh avocados, lime juice, cilantro, diced tomatoes, and onions served with tortilla chips.
- Queso Fundido: Melted cheese with chorizo, served with warm tortillas.

Main Course

- Huevos Mexicanos: Scrambled eggs with tomatoes, onions, and jalapeños, similar to what Dafne was eating.
- Chicken Enchiladas: Corn tortillas filled with shredded chicken, topped with a rich tomato sauce and melted cheese.

Side Dishes

- Mexican Rice: Fluffy rice cooked with tomatoes, onions, and garlic.
- Refried Beans: Creamy pinto beans cooked with onions and spices.

Dessert

 Churros with Chocolate Sauce: Fried dough pastries rolled in cinnamon sugar, served with a warm chocolate dipping sauce.

Drinks

- Horchata: A refreshing rice milk drink flavored with cinnamon and vanilla.
- Margaritas: Classic lime margaritas, perfect for a book club gathering.

THEMED MENU SUGGESTIONS



Dafne's Dilemma

Ingredients:

- 1 oz espresso (for Dafne's busy mornings)
- 1 oz Irish cream liqueur (a nod to her past with Oliver)
- 1 oz Kahlua (representing her Mexican heritage)
- 1 oz vanilla syrup (for a touch of sweetness)
- 2 oz milk or cream (to smooth out the flavors)
- Ice cubes
- Whipped cream (optional)
- Cinnamon or cocoa powder (for garnish)

Instructions:

- Prepare the espresso and let it cool slightly.
- Fill a shaker with ice cubes.
- Add the espresso, Irish cream liqueur, Kahlua, vanilla syrup, and milk/cream to the shaker.
- Shake well until the mixture is chilled.
- Strain into a glass filled with ice.
- Top with whipped cream if desired.
- Garnish with a sprinkle of cinnamon or cocoa powder.
